

Beauty by Taisiya – Microblading treatment

Fact Sheet - FAQ

How long does it last?

It can vary from person to person depending on:

- How well the aftercare is adhered to
- Skin type (oilier skin doesn't last as long)
- Lifestyle
- Sun/sunbed exposure
- Medication

These are just a few examples that could potentially fade your cosmetics prematurely. As a general rule, they last around a year on average before needing a colour boost.

How long does the appointment take?

The first initial appointment including a consultation, takes around 2-3 hours start to finish. A top up appointment takes around 1 hour.

How much are the top ups?

Prices after initial treatment.

How often shall I have a top up/why do I need a top up?

Within the initial price, a free top up is included. This is required to be done between 4-8 weeks after initial treatment. Any top ups after that are as and when you feel you need them. It depends on things such as how well they hold (due to the factors mentioned above) and what style of brow you like (more natural or bolder) etc.

A free top up is offered after the initial treatment because the pigment isn't recognised in the skin the first-time round as your skin thinks it's a foreign body. The second time the pigment is implanted, the skin then recognises it and it will hold. The top up is used to correct colour, shape and to reinforce the pigment. Without having the included top up, you are having half a treatment.

<u>Colour</u>

Colour is based on your natural eyebrow hair colour, it is then mixed with tones that will suit your skin tone. We can discuss further in your consultation if you have specific requirements. I have a wide range of assorted colours so I can match your colour as best I can. The colour is expected to fade after your first treatment as the skin doesn't recognise it. It is corrected and reinforced with the top up. Initially the colour will appear very bold and vivid, as the pigment is sat on top of the skin as it's open. Once healed, colour will soften and appear much more natural. This is because layers of skin have healed over the top of the pigment.

Does it hurt?

It would be unethical if I said it was pain free. However, everyone has different pain thresholds. I have had clients saying it doesn't hurt, it just feels uncomfortable; ranging to clients saying it's as painful as threading or epilating. Everyone is different, personally I don't think it hurts, for me it feels uncomfortable. Don't worry about that, it'll all be worth it in the end trust me!

Can I just have my natural shape filled in?

Unfortunately, not, a shape is drawn on to suit your bone structure and face shape. There wouldn't be much point in having them done, as the procedure is to enhance and improve your shape.

Can I pick my own shape?

A specific shape of brow is drawn on to suit your bone structure. However requirements such as how steep you want the arch, how long you want your brows or thickness is added/tweaked within that shape design. Before any pigment is applied, you ok the shape. You shouldn't feel like you can't ask to change something as it's not my face, it's yours. I encourage pickiness as I was them to be perfect for you. It's a team effort to get the best shape for your face structure and also within requirements set by yourself.

What is the maintenance like?

Having your brows done is extremely low maintenance, HOWEVER, I strongly recommend you have a regular brow tidy to maintain the shape and keep it looking fresh and beautiful. A lot of the time, the new shape we create is slightly higher than most peoples natural tail, meaning the brow hair will still grow back; to stop the appearance of "two tails" it is highly recommended you come for maintenance to stop this happening. Otherwise, keeping on top of it yourself is very easy too, by plucking the hairs that aren't in your shape has the same effect, keeping them nice and tidy.

Can you do it mobile?

I can't do it mobile as I have to adhere to strict health and hygiene regulations.

Is it like tattooing?

It is a form of tattooing but there are differences. The pigment isn't implanted as deep as a usual tattoo, therefore it's permanent cosmetic makeup. Pigment is used and not ink. I class it as Permanent Makeup, the pigment will fade over time considerably, but you will/may still end up with some pigment residing in your skin.

What is the process?

From start to finish, it is an (average) 8 week process to get your desired result.
